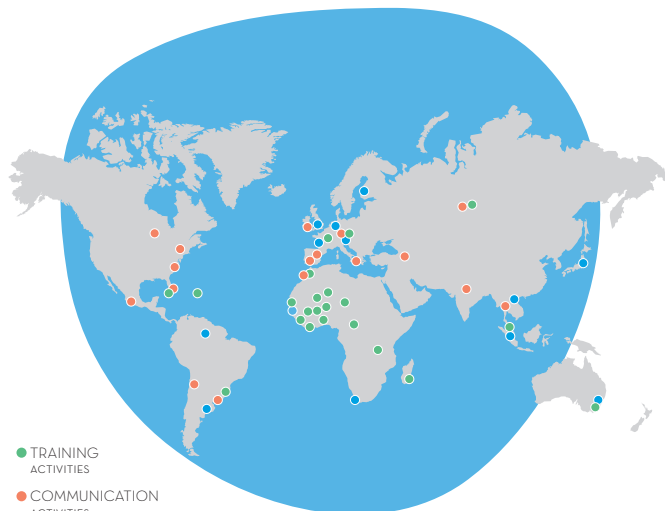

INSPIRE PROJECTS AND ACTIONS AROUND THE WORLD

OUR ACTIVITIES ARE FOCUSED ON EDUCATION ABOUT SEXUAL HEALTH. THEY ARE BASED ON A CONSTRUCTIVE AND COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO HUMAN RELATIONSHIPS, SEXUAL BEHAVIOUR AND REPRODUCTION, IN THE RESPECT OF HUMAN RIGHTS.

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

- Laboratory of reflection and strategies: "Think tanks".
- Elaboration of pilot training modules for policy makers and professionals concerned.
- Organization of innovation days in education and research.
- Organization of innovation awards in education and research.
- Participation in expert groups in specialized agencies of the United Nations including WHO.
- Development of International Scientific Interdisciplinary Committee.

COMMUNICATION ACTIVITIES

- Intervention in national and international congresses.
- Promotion of Sexual Health in partnership with academic and civil societies.
- Publication and distribution of books and articles.
- Promotion of human rights in collaboration with international agencies, academic and civil societies.
- Development of website and social networks.
- Development of education "tools" for sexuality in collaboration with the Centre of information and prevention of AIDS (Centre Régional d'Information et Prévention Sida (CRIPS)).

TRAINING ACTIVITIES

- Creation and organization of diplomas at Paris Diderot University and Sorbonne Paris Cite (USPC), and international academic teaching.
- Development of UNITWIN International Network of UNESCO Chairs around Sexual Health and Human Rights.
- Development of open education training to professionals, "Small Private Online Courses" with USPC and foreign universities.
- Creating open education modules to the general public, "Massive Open Online Courses".
- Develop innovative training in Sexual Health and Human Rights in partnership with civil societies and governments.
